At risk at Not-for-profit Agencies

As direct care workers in Connecticut's group homes and not-for-profit agencies we are over worked & underpaid. The State of Connecticut has not provided a Cost Of Living Increase in over 4 years. The cost of our medical benefits has increased each year. We can't take the crunch any more & are suffering.

But thanks to the over 50 Union members who came to the 1199 Union office December 13, 2011 to meet with Malloy's Commissioner of Labor, Glenn Marshall, the Governor put a 1 % effective January 2013 in his State budget proposal for not-for-profit agencies like ours. That is a start, but it's not enough or soon enough. It is our job to push for true improvements.

Join us on Tuesday, April 10th to educate legislators about our crisis as Health Care Workers who can no longer afford Medical Coverage for ourselves or our children & can no longer make ends meet. This forum is sponsored by the Co-Chairs of the Public Health Committee.

On Tuesday, April 10th we need to fill the hearing room with group home & not-for-profit agency workers to show the legislators we can't take being underpaid, over worked & without medical benefits any longer.
